Recent Highlight— Finishing Well

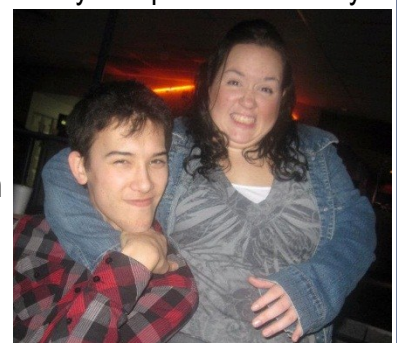

What God's Been Teaching Us (Jeff)

It's easy to think that serving the Lord *more* (by giving more time to ministry) automatically means our relationship with the Lord is better or that we are walking more closely with God, but in fact it can mean the opposite. Often ministry itself can get in the way of our relationship with God, and the more we put into it, the less useful we are to Him. A friend of mine sent me a link to [an article](#) that talks about how our work and our hearts are constantly shifting between two masters.

Based on [Matthew 6:19-34](#), he says that "Christ gives us only two options. Either I've attached my identity, meaning, purpose, and inner sense of well-being to the earth-bound treasures of the kingdom of self or to the heavenly treasures of the kingdom of God." As a heart check, he says to ask the following: Missing *what* causes us to want to give up and quit? Pursuing *what* leads us to feeling overwhelmed? Fearing *what* makes us timid rather than hopeful? Craving for *what* makes us burn the candle at both ends? The "need" for *what* robs life of beauty and joy? Desiring *what* sets up tensions between work/ministry and family?

For me, I am torn between the desire to be useful and successful in my work, and to provide stability and value to my family. The author suggests that what we are looking for in work, relationships or even ministry is what only Christ can give us, and already has. My value, success, hope and stability won't be created by my own hand!
